To what degree is learning enhanced by guided BLOG threads?

Description: The findings reveal evidence of a degree to which collaborative peer-to-peer blogging did encourage critical thinking while seeking a team solution to a complex problem. This presentation reveals results using Blackboard Discussion Forum as a tool for capturing the blog style writing while researching a complex topic for a team case study.

“SMART” goals are nothing new

- According to Crispin (2013), this familiar mnemonic is a “reminder to make our goals Specific, Measurable, Action-oriented, Realistic, and Timely” (Crispin, 2013).
- “Practicing managers and corporations can lose the benefit of a more abstract objective in order to gain quantification. **It is the combination of the objective and its action plan that is really important.** Therefore, serious management should focus on these twins and not just the objective” (Doran, 1981).

How to focus a team on becoming S M A R T ?

- **Specific** - *Why: Specific reasons, purpose or benefits of accomplishing the goal.*
- **Measurable** - *How much? How will I know when it is accomplished?*
- **Attainable/Achievable** - *How? How can the goal be accomplished?*
- **Relevant** - *Does this match our other efforts/needs?*
- **Time bound** - *What can I do today?*

...collaborative blogging encouraging critical thinking...

What is blog-style writing?

Holley Hanson summarizes the literature with her interpretation that “blog-style writing is generally detailed focused yet concise, may (but does not always) prioritize reflection over generating new arguments, employs a more conversational tone and uses interactive citations through hyperlinking” (2016, p.92).

...blogging as “microlevel” thinking...

What is blog writing?

Holley Hanson (2016) summarized her pilot research project with some testimonials. A participant described blog-writing as “microlevel” thinking compared to essay-writing as requiring “macrolevel” thinking, acknowledging that this observation is driven by the nature of blog writing norms.

She states that “Blog posts seemed to feature more concise writing that emphasized simpler linguistic structures” (p. 97) and encourage students to develop key communication and summarizing skills.

Blogging in the Classroom

Blogging is about writing and reading NOT about a technology platform. When using a classroom or student blogs, a global learning community and communication center can grow to facilitate student learning for 21st Century skills and literacies.

Introduction to Blogging

Being able to read AND express yourself in a digital world is an important part of being literate in the 21st century. Blogging is a way of linking writing, reading, connecting information and learning together.

START

Why Blogging?

Provide your students with an authentic learning opportunity, give them a global audience, and engage them in conversation. Blogs are the platform that support 21st century skills and literacies, from communicating to connecting, from Digital Citizenship to information, network, global and media literacy.

Reading

Becoming an avid blog reader of a variety of blogs is the first step for teachers and students to gain confidence, articulate learning goals and objective and gauging quality. Reading blogs with metacognitive analysis in mind, will help expose readers to the potential blogging holds in relationship to LEARNING. Reading blogs also gives opportunities to make connections.

Digital Citizenship

Through blogging, students receive exposure to mini lessons, woven into teachable moments. Among digital citizenship lessons are appropriate and responsible online behavior, Internet safety, digital footprint, plagiarism, copyright and Creative Commons.

STEP 2

Quality

Reading, responding, assessing and monitoring students' progress on blogs requires pedagogical commitment. It is a commitment to student learning and quality work, not a commitment to using a specific technology platform.

Commenting

Read comments (...lots of comments) to learn to distinguish between poor, mediocre and quality comments. Model commenting to your students by leaving QUALITY comments on their blogs. Commenting is about continuing a conversation started in a blog post. Commenting is about helping to (potentially) push the author of the post in a new direction, give a new perspective or connect them to new resources.

Writing

Writing is age and developmentally appropriate with content, grammar and vocabulary focus. Blog posts contain quality, relevant content and traditional quality writing characteristics. They show evidence of writing for an audience. Writing can be reflective. Attention paid to logistics of digital writing, such as hyperlinking, embedding media, categorization, etc.

Global Communication Hub

The blog(s) has(have) become the central hub to showcase student work, reflect on learning, being part of a conversation, a platform to embed media and link to further information. Students write for a global authentic audience.

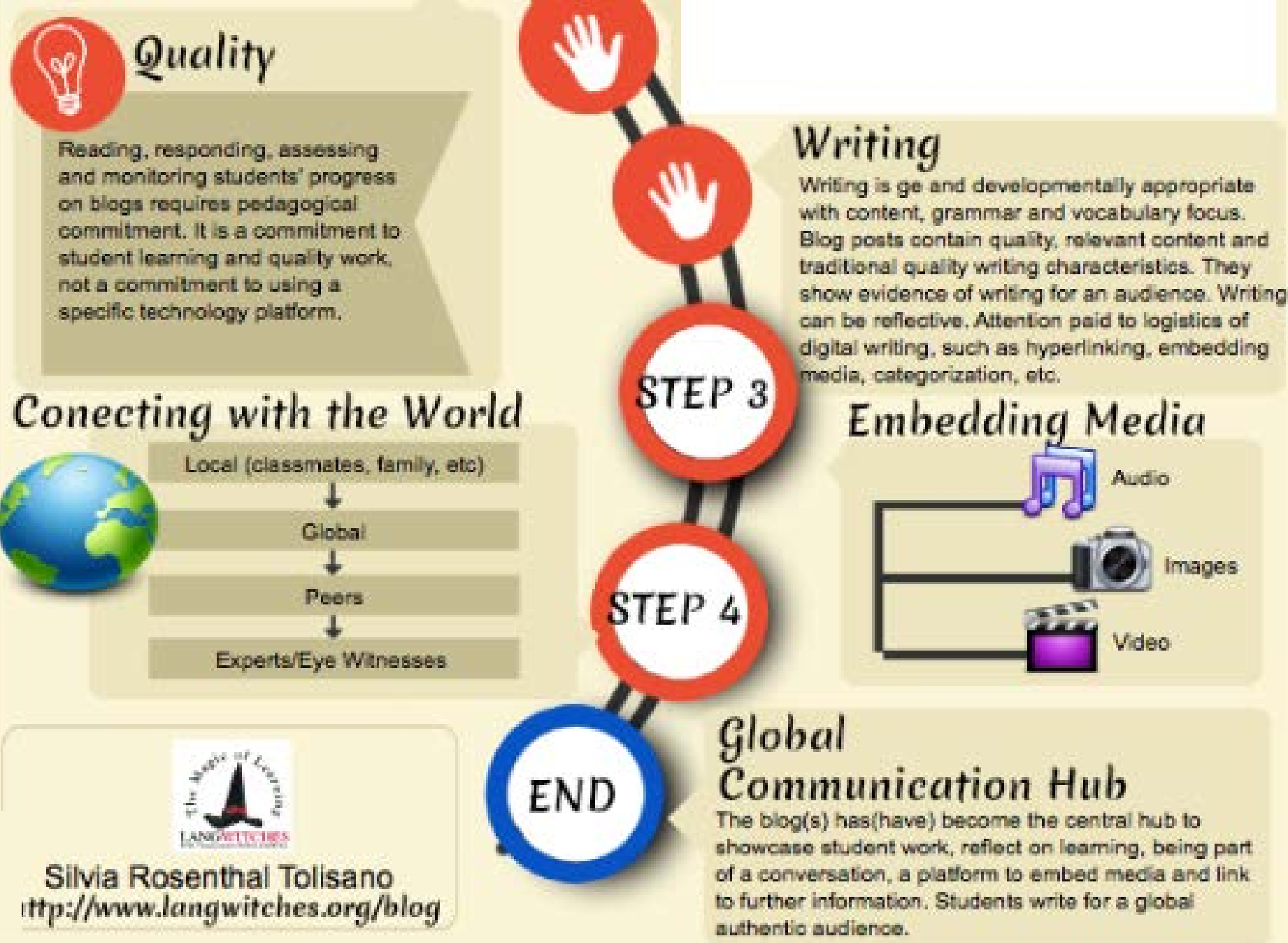

In defense of blogging in a BlackBoard (Bb) course

An inspiration of this research, to increase effective communications

“The brief nature of blog posts may encourage students to develop key communication and summarizing skills, while longer papers give students more room to compare and synthesize ideas” [Hanson, 2016, p. 98]. My research focused on serving as “further testing” of Hanson’s suggestion that blogging and short essays be complementary assignments.

Bb discussion threads redefined as “blogs”?

The environment of a Bb course does constrain the meaning of “blogging”. Bb is a container limited to an audience of learners who share an agenda, to pass a prescribed course. My incentive was to enhance the learning objectives.

- For *on-campus students*, live discussion during live time is a direct experience with nothing tangible, as a written message. In-Class student had low tolerance for posting after talking, but did so as a group post, for the earned points.

Limitation of “blogging” in a Blackboard course

Blackboard courses are a private place for students to upload assignments and to download articles and instructions.

Blackboard does not offer to align with the “public nature of blog posts meaning that students are engaging in blog-style writing but not blogging” (Hansen, 2016, p.91).

For this research, in advance of day 1, the DQs were re-imagined & restated as **Blog prompts** to encourage original thinking, retrieving & sharing interesting ideas and images, and also to cite sources so that others can navigate to the source webpage. The Bb features of posting a concise message with more-than-just-text was encouraged and demonstrated.

Bb “blogging” as sharing new learning

During this period, blogging became **peer-to-peer (P2P)** experience that that gained a momentum and a very active participation.

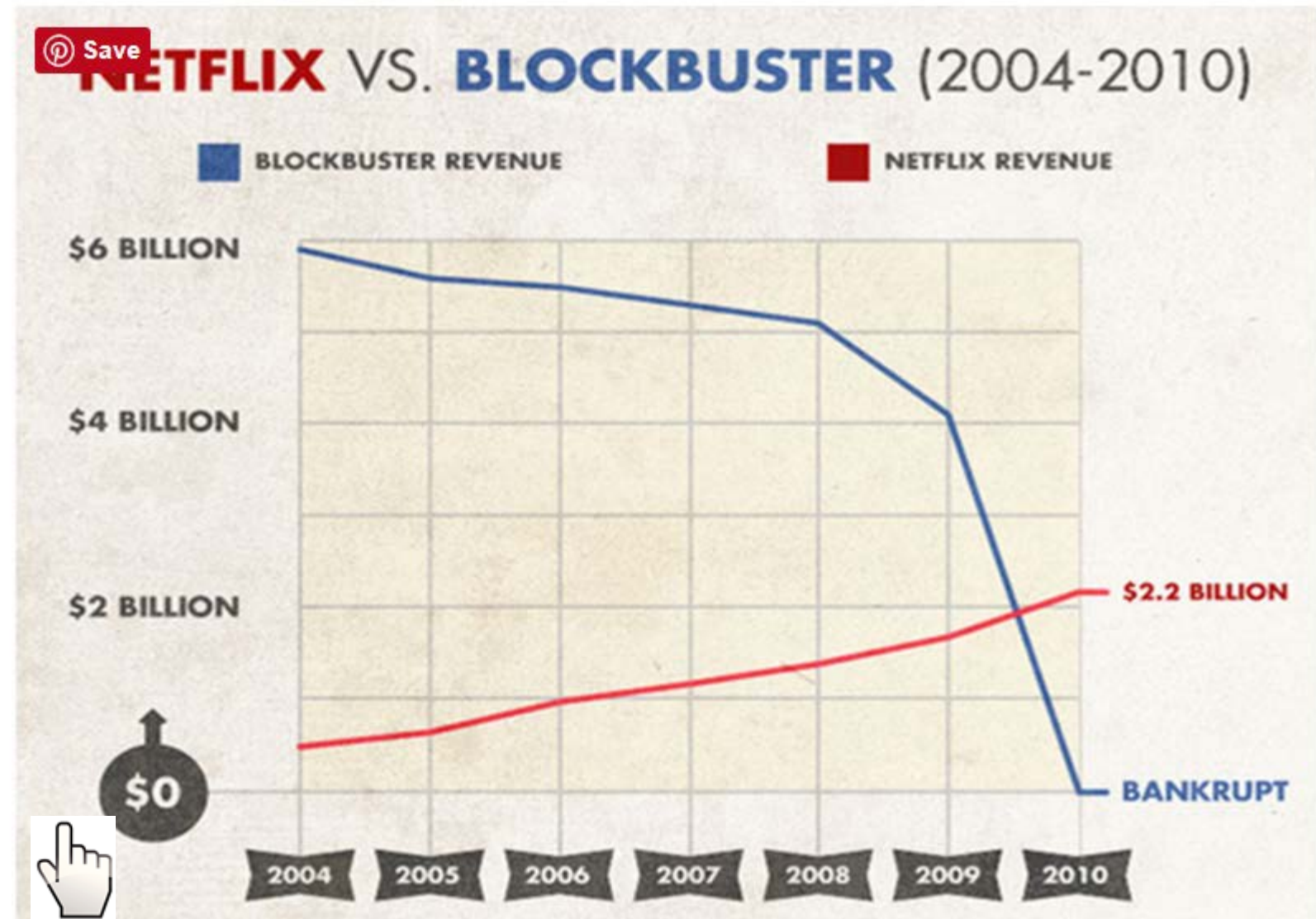

Here's a slide that sums everything up.

Case study Blockbuster

- Blockbuster was a “bricks and mortar” video rental service that went into administration in 2013
- Netflix started operating a postal rental service in 1997 that was a subscription service, no late fees. Netflix then moved into digital downloads
- Blockbuster in response cut its late fees which was a significant part of its revenue, and moved into being a convenience store with DVD rental
- Netflix was “disruptive innovation” in that when one service is invented it destroys another
- Blockbuster failed to see that a niche idea was going to go global and become a \$2.8 billion dollar a year industry
- Reason for failure – refusing to move with the times in a dynamic market

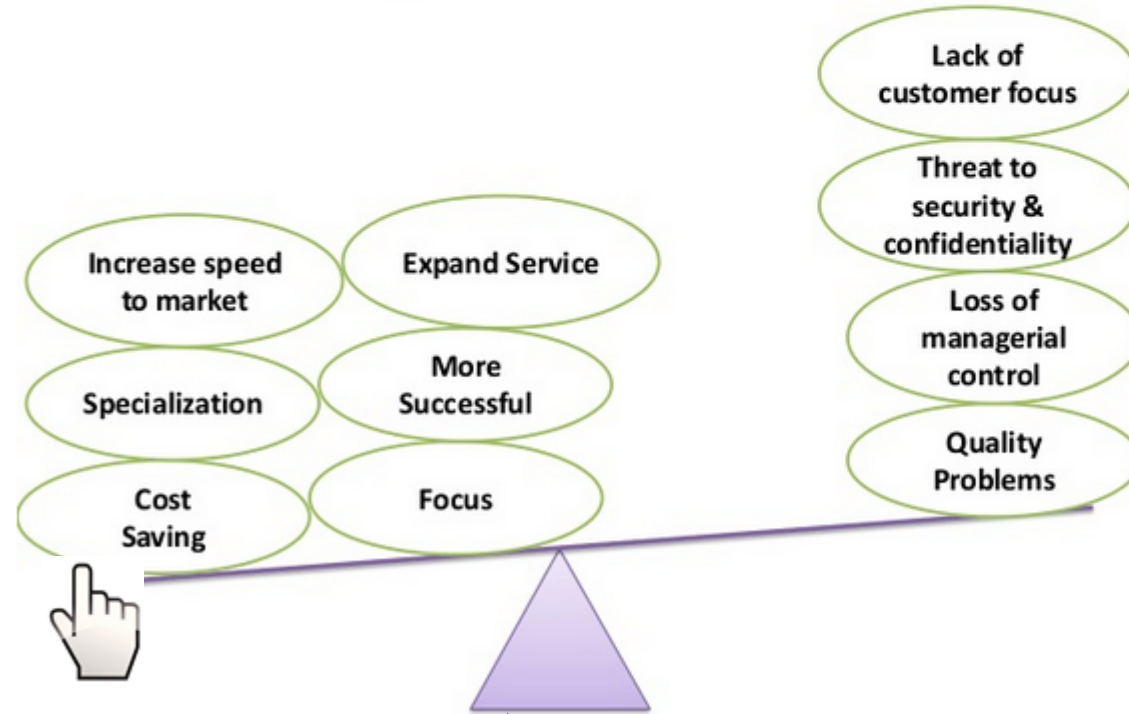

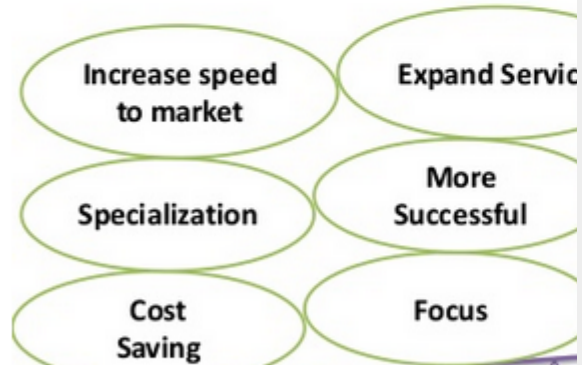

We could use a scalable platform like Nutanix - <https://www.nutanix.com/solutions/vdi/>

These boxes provision CPU, RAM, cold and hot data. We could have a mess system with two different physical locations. This would provide redundancy in the event of an outage.

In addition to T1 lines, we can run each site though a packet shaper - <https://my.mtm.com/packeteer.aspx>

This would allow us to establish quality of service rules to prioritize certain traffic. The packet shaper also offers compression to give higher throughput.
